#### **GOSPEL**

(Read at the procession before Mass)

#### Matthew 21:1-11

When they drew near to Jerusalem and came to Bethphage, to the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two disciples, saying to them, 'Go into the village opposite you, and immediately you will find an ass tied, and a colt with her; untie them and bring them to me. If anyone says anything to you, you shall say, "The Lord has need of them," and he will send them immediately'. This took place to fulfil what was spoken by the prophet, saying,

'Tell the daughter of Zion, Behold, your king is coming to you, humble and mounted on an ass, and on a colt, the foal of an ass'.

The disciples went and did as Jesus directed them; they brought the ass and the colt, and put their garments on them, and he sat thereon. Most of the crowd spread their garments on the road, and others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. And the crowds that went before him and that followed him shouted.

'Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!'

And when he entered Jerusalem all the city was stirred, saying, 'Who is this?' And the crowds said, 'This is the prophet Jesus from Nazareth of Galilee'.

The Lord has given me a disciple's tongue. So that I may know how to reply to the wearied he provides me with speech. Each morning he wakes me to hear, to listen like a disciple. The Lord has opened my ear. For my part, I made no resistance, neither did I turn away. I offered my back to those who struck me, my cheeks to those who tore at my beard; I did not cover my face against insult and spittle. The Lord comes to my help, so that I am untouched by the insults. So, too, I set my face like flint; I know I shall not be shamed.

## THE PRACTICE OF SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

Our Churches are closed. We cannot attend Mass and receive Holy Communion.

From Pope Francis: United to Christ we are never alone, but instead form one body of which He is the head. It is a union that is nourished with prayer and also with spiritual communion in the Eucharist, a practice that is recommended when it isn't possible to receive the sacrament.

The practice of Spiritual Communion is a longstanding Catholic tradition. It was confirmed in 1983 by the

## Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith which declared that:

All the effects of Holy Communion can be received **through spiritual communion** for persons in the following situation:

"Those who are prevented from attending Eucharistic celebrations."

#### How do we go about the practice of Spiritual Communion:



- Set aside some time in a quiet place.
- 2. Make an act of true contrition. (The Confiteor is recommended but other acts of contrition can be used.)
- 3. Recite the following prayer of St. Alphonsus Liguori:

O my Jesus,
I believe that You are present
in the Blessed Sacrament.
I love You above all things and
I desire Your presence in my soul.
Since I cannot now receive You
sacramentally, come at least
spiritually into my heart.
As though You were already there,
I embrace You and
unite myself wholly to You.
Permit not that I should ever be

separated from You. Amen.4. Spend some quiet time in prayer.

A good time might be while you are joining in an online Mass.

#### **OUR ARCHBISHOP AND THE VIRUS**



Archbishopdesignate Patrick
O'Regan has
delivered a
message of hope for
Adelaide
parishioners despite

being stranded in Victoria by coronavirus travel restrictions

"People will come back to understanding what is important at this difficult time ... being together, supporting each other and having hope," he said from his diocese in Sale on Wednesday.

Archbishop-designate O'Regan was due to be in Adelaide on Wednesday for meetings, but instead was set to be briefed by key officeholders over a videoconference about the issues faced by the archdiocese, which has been without a leader for almost two years since the resignation of Archbishop Philip Wilson in July 2018. "The video conference will just be to take a pulse, get the temperature and get a sense of the recent history and how all the bits and pieces fit together," Archbishop-designate O'Regan said. "It is a bit frustrating not being able to physically be there."

Archbishop-designate O'Regan said he hoped to be in Adelaide at some time after Easter, "even if I have to self-isolate for two weeks".

According to canon law his installation at the Adelaide cathedral must happen within two months, but Archbishop-designate O'Regan said it would likely be a closed ceremony because of COVID-19 restrictions. *CathNews*

The Passion of our Lo

The Passion of our Lord, Jesus Christ according to Matthew.

From the sixth hour there was darkness over all the land until the ninth hour. And about the ninth hour, Jesus cried out in a loud voice, 'Eli, Eli, lama sabachthani', that is, "My God, my God, why have you deserted me?" ...But Jesus, again crying out in a loud voice, yielded up his spirit.

At that, the veil of the Temple was torn in two from top to bottom ... Meanwhile the centurion, together with the others guarding Jesus, had seen the earthquake and all that was taking place, and they were terrified and said, 'In truth this was a son of God'. And many were there watching from a distance, the same women who had followed Jesus from Galilee and looked after him. Among them were Mary of Magdala, Mary the mother of James and Joseph, and the mother of Zebedee's sons.

When it was evening there came a rich man of Arimathaea, called Joseph, who had himself become a disciple of Jesus. This man went to

Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus. Pilate thereupon ordered it to be handed over ...



#### DID YOU KNOW?

- The words of Jesus from the cross in this text are in Aramaic, the language Jesus spoke.
- The name Barabbas literally means son (bar) of the father (abba). Here the crowd choses the false son while condemning the true Son.
- This Sunday is also known as 'Palm Sunday' and commemorates Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. Celebrations similar to those carried out in churches today (in normal times) were being held in Jerusalem as early as the fourth century.
- The narratives of the Passion of Jesus the arrest, trial, crucifixion and death are the earliest strands of what came to be written down as the gospels.
- Since the fourth century the site now marked by the Church of the Holy Sepulchre has been revered as the site of Calvary.
