Our vision is to build a faith community, centred on the loving relationship of Father, Son and Holy Spirit, expressed in personal lives and in communal Parish activities.


#### IT IS OUR MISSION TO:

#### **FIRST READING** 1 Samuel 16:1, 6-7, 10-13 The Lord said to Samuel, 'Fill your horn with oil and go. I am sending you to Jesse of Bethlehem, for I have chosen myself a king among his sons.' When Samuel arrived, he caught sight of Eliab and thought, 'Surely the Lord's anointed one stands there before him,' but the Lord said to Samuel, 'Take no notice of his appearance or his height, for I have rejected him: God does not see as man sees: man looks at appearances but the Lord looks at the heart.' Jesse presented his seven sons to Samuel. but Samuel said to Jesse, 'The Lord has not chosen these.' He then asked Jesse, 'Are these all the sons you have?' He answered, 'There is still one left, the youngest; he is out looking after the sheep.' Then Samuel said to Jesse, 'Send for him; we will not sit down to eat until he comes.<sup>3</sup> Jesse had him sent for, a boy of fresh complexion, with fine eyes and pleasant bearing. The Lord said, Come, anoint him, for this is the one.' At this, Samuel took the horn of oil and anointed him where he stood with his brothers; and the spirit of the Lord seized on David and stayed with him from that day on.

#### **SECOND READING** *Ephesians 5:8-14*

You were darkness once, but now you are light in the Lord; be like children of light, for the effects of the light are seen in complete goodness and right living and truth. Try to discover what the Lord wants of you, having nothing to do with the futile works of darkness but exposing them by contrast. The things which are done in secret are things that people are ashamed even to speak of; but anything exposed by the light will be illuminated and anything illuminated turns into light. That is why it is said:

Wake up from your sleep, rise from the dead, and Christ will shine on you.



# ANNUNCIATION OF THE LORD Feast Day 25th March

In this beautiful feast Mary teaches us how to live our Christian life. When the Angel of the Lord appeared, bearing the message and calling her to a special mission, she said "YES." We too have the



choice to say "Yes" as well and believe that "nothing is impossible with God."

Each of us can say "Yes" to God, right now, wherever we are. Each of us can respond with our entire being, with a "Yes" of surrendered love, so that the same God who was made flesh within her takes up His residence in us.

#### SYMBOLS

Both of our churches have beautiful works of art that draw us visually into the mystery of life and into the heart of the God who created it and came share it with us. At St Joan's Centenary Mass Monsignor Rob Egar drew our attention to further understandings of the symbols used in the Centenary windows.

One of these symbols is the pelican. Not only is this majestic creature part of our local bird life and an indigenous symbol, it also has a special

meaning in the history of our faith. It is known to have great devotion to its young, shedding its blood for their survival It is for Christians a symbol of Christ who too shed His blood so that we might live. Monsignor Egar also referred to the tiny ants that are to be found on the windows

and St Augustine's words:

"Emulate the tiny ant; be an ant of God. Listen to the word of God and hide it in your heart. Collect plenty of food during the happy days of your spiritual summers. You will then be able to endure the difficult days of temptations during the winters of your soul."

#### (St. Augustine)

And a final thought.

The windows contain all the elements, earth, water, air, fire, linking us to St Francis' beautiful canticle where he speaks of the elements as members of our family, *Brothers Wind and Air, Sister Water, Brother Fire, and Sister Earth, our Mother.* They are deserving of our gratitude and care.

His neighbours and people who earlier had seen him begging said, 'Isn't this the man who used to sit and beg?' Some said, 'Yes, it is the same one.' Others said, 'No, he only looks like him.' The man himself said, 'I am the man.'

They brought the man who had been blind to the Pharisees. It had been a sabbath day when Jesus made the paste and opened the man's eyes, so when the Pharisees asked him how he had come to see, he said, 'He put a paste on my eyes, and I washed, and I can see.'

Then some of the Pharisees said, 'This man cannot be from God: he does not keep the sabbath.' Others said, 'How could a sinner produce signs like this?' And there was disagreement among them. So they spoke to the blind man again, 'What have you to say about him yourself, now that he has opened your eyes?' 'He is a prophet' replied the man.

'Are you trying to teach us,' they replied 'and you a sinner through and through, since you were born!' And they drove him away.

Jesus heard they had driven him away, and when he found him he said to him, 'Do you believe in the Son of Man?' 'Sir,' the man replied 'tell me who he is so that I may believe in him.' Jesus said, 'You are looking at him; he is speaking to you.' The man said, 'Lord, I believe', and worshipped him. Jesus said:

'It is for judgement that I have come into this world, so that those without sight may see and those with sight turn blind.'

Hearing this, some Pharisees who were present said to him, 'We are not blind, surely?' Jesus replied:

'Blind? If you were, you would not be guilty, but since you say, "We see," your guilt remains.'



# DID YOU KNOW

• In Jesus' time, blindness and other illnesses were seen as punishment for sin.

- The Sabbath was a day for God, and no work could be done. The action of 'making a paste' was considered work, so the Pharisees accuse Jesus of breaking the Sabbath laws.
- The Pool of Siloam was famous from ancient times as it was a pool inside the city walls of Jerusalem that was linked by a tunnel, built by King Hezekiah, to the Gihon Spring outside the city. This meant that during times of siege, the city always had a water supply.

#### SYMBOLS AND IMAGES

Today's text again traces the journey towards faith of the man who was born blind and contrasts his openness to the revelation of Jesus as the light of the world to the 'blindness' of the Pharisees, who do not see or recognise the truth of who Jesus is.
