

#### **FIRST READING**

Acts 2:1-11

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome – Jews and proselytes alike - Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

No one can say, 'Jesus is Lord' unless he is under the influence of the Holy Spirit.

There is a variety of gifts but always the same Spirit; there are all sorts of service to be done, but always to the same Lord; working in all sorts of different ways in different people, it is the same God who is working in all of them. The particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose.

Just as a human body, though it is made up of many parts, is a single unit because all these parts, though many, make one body, so it is with Christ. In the one Spirit we were all baptised, Jews as well as Greeks, slaves as well as citizens, and one Spirit was given to us all to drink.

#### OUR LADY ST. MARY OF THE GOOD AIR



This is the full name for Buenos Aires, Argentina, a contrasting city of the rich and poor. Pope Francis was Archbishop here and Pope Souvenirs abound, many quite ugly! It is the home of the tango, has the widest avenue in the world and is the birth place of Evita Peron, Argentina's late first lady. A building has her image on two sides; a smiling face towards the poor district and a stern image facing the affluent area. She was devoted to the poorer class and unpopular with the upper class. Today she is almost revered. The phrase "don't cry for me Argentina" was coined by an Englishman, but not much liked by the Argentines! The Recoletos Monks built a convent and church here in the early 18th century. When they left, the large gardens became a cemetery of 6,400 mausoleums and is laid out like a city. Eva Peron who died in 1952 at age 33 is buried here, by tradition, in her family's (name Duarte) crypt. This crypt is always covered in fresh flowers. The original monk's church, named "Our Lady of Pilar" still stands next to the cemetery and is in very good condition. Helen & Peter Sampson

#### ST. BONIFACE, Martyr Feast Day 5<sup>th</sup> June

St. Boniface was born around 675 in what is



today known as the county of Devon, England. He studied in English monasteries before travelling to Europe, where he converted pagan peoples in present-day Germany and the Netherlands.

In his role as a bishop and archbishop, he also worked on church reforms. After returning to missionary work, Boniface was killed by pagan tribespeople in Frisia on June 5, 754, at the approximate age of 80.

# LAUNCH OF "FRIENDS OF FRANCIS"

Friends of Francis hopes to be a community of Catholics across the Fleurieu and Kangaroo Island region, who support each other to be actively involved in working for social justice, peace through non-violence, and care for creation. Inspired by Pope Francis' witness and call to us to bring hope to the world in crisis, we will also be taking heart from the example of St Francis of Assisi, whose life has inspired so many to give their hearts in loving service to those in need.

To celebrate World Environment Day and Pentecost Sunday, on Sunday 4 June there will be a "Stations of Creation" in Aldinga Scrub Conservation Park, offering the opportunity to hear God speaking to us through this beautiful coastal bush.

The gathering at Galilee Community Room will begin at 3.00pm and conclude by 4.30pm. If you cannot

participate in the Scrub walk you will be very welcome to join in at the gathering.

#### **EXPLORING THE WORD**

Despite the promise of Jesus that he would not leave his disciples 'orphaned' (see Sixth Sunday of Easter), after his death, they huddle in fear in the upper room. He comes among them, not offering recriminations at their lack of faith, but offering peace – a peace won through the cross and resurrection. Just as Jesus is transformed by this experience, so too, the disciples' fear turns to joy. In the giving of his Spirit, Jesus literally breathes life back into the disciples. They are to go out and continue his work of forgiveness, judgement and witness in the world.

#### **DID YOU KNOW?**

Pentecost was originally a Jewish harvest festival which was celebrated fifty days after the Passover. It was one of the great 'pilgrimage' festivals which meant that people came to celebrate this feast at the Temple. It was for this festival that so many pilgrims were present in Jerusalem on the day when the Spirit was manifested in the lives of the disciples.
