FIRST READING

Wisdom 9:13-18

So if all that we have in common means anything to you, welcome him as you would me.

CATHOLIC CHARITIES APPEAL 2016

"Never see a need without doing some-
thing about it" was one of the sayings of St.
Mary MacKillop and is what drives us to as-
sist struggling families and individuals in our
own community.

ON ANY GIVEN DAY IN SOUTH AUSTRALIA

- ◇ Over 200 homeless people have a meal, shower, seek medical treatment, use the laundry and access professional services and case management at Hutt Street Centre, where they feel safe.

MERCY HOUSE OF WELCOME

- ◇ 40 clients a day come for ESL classes. Over 400 clients on the data base, 80 volunteers teach ESL classes.
- ◇ Clients are Hazara, Iraqi, Iranian, Sri Lankan and Vietnamese.
- ◇ Offers informal child minding services over school holidays.
- ◇ A space for asylum seekers to access support services and break down isolation.

CATHERINE HOUSE

- ◇ Provides an emergency program with 16 women staying anywhere between 2 days and 3 months.
- ◇ Access to a range of clinical support services.
- ◇ Assists women in reconnecting with children and families.

OTHERWAY CENTRE - ABORIGINAL CATHOLIC MINISTRY

- ◇ Over 100 people who travel from remote lands to visit hospital can access a linen and toiletry bag program.
- ◇ Approximately 12 homeless and vulnerable people visit the centre per week with workshops and programs including art and craft group, dancing classes, providing healthy lunches.

GOSPEL

Luke 14:25-33

Great crowds accompanied Jesus on his way and he turned and spoke to them. 'If any man comes to me without hating his father, mother, wife, children, brothers, sisters, yes and his own life too, he cannot be my disciple. Anyone who does not carry his cross and come after me cannot be my disciple.

'And indeed, which of you here, intending to build a tower, would not first sit down and work out the cost to see if he had enough to complete it? Otherwise, if he laid the foundation and then found himself unable to finish the work, the onlookers would all start making fun of him and saying, "Here is a man who started to build and was unable to finish." Or again, what king marching to war against another king would not first sit down and consider whether with ten thousand men he could stand up to the other who advanced against him with twenty thousand? If not, then while the other king was still a long way off, he would send envoys to sue for peace. So in the same way, none of you can be my disciple unless he gives up all his possessions.'

SHARING THE TRADITION

'In the same way, unless you give up all your possessions you cannot be my disciple.' Perhaps these words of Jesus are best understood as a readiness to renounce worldly wealth if that becomes a hindrance to following his way. It implies the need for an attitude of detachment from the things of this world. There is a strong tradition of complete renunciation of personal belongings among those taking special vows to religious life within the Church, but each believer is invited to ponder the meaning of Christ's words and our response to them.

The Church teaches that Earth and its riches belong to all people. No-one has an intrinsic right to more of Earth's goods than another. At the same time, to guarantee personal freedom and dignity and to provide for their needs, each person has a right to private property. We must

manage the inherent tension between meeting our own material needs and the needs of all other people on Earth. Our attitude to our own property must be governed by moderation, concern for justice and a sense of solidarity with those who have less.

- How difficult is it for you to control the desire to 'have' more rather than to 'be' more?
- What possessions mean the most to you?

DID YOU KNOW?

- The use of the term 'hate' in today's text should not be taken to mean hatred as such, but rather should be understood as pointing to things which may hinder the single-mindedness needed to take up the call to discipleship.
- The Greek word *ekklesia*, used for the Church, means being called out from or apart from others. This understanding is suggested by Jesus' words in this text.
- A recurrent theme in Luke's Gospel is that obsessive attachment to money or material wealth is a hindrance to a full and complete relationship with God. It distracts people from what is really important in life.
