ST ANTHONY OF PADUA

Feast Day 13th June (1195 – 1231)

This very popular saint was born at Lisbon in Portugal in a wealthy family. He was baptized and named "Ferdinand."

When he joined the Franciscan Order, the other Franciscan friars had no idea how brilliant and talented Anthony was or of how much education he had received.

One day, at a large gathering of priests, when the speaker failed to arrive, Anthony was forced to preach. He preached such a marvellous sermon that everyone who heard him was most impressed. From then on, until he died nine years later, Anthony preached all over Italy and France. He was so popular that people even closed their stores to go to hear him. He is well known now as the patron saint of lost items.



ST BARNABAS, APOSTLE

Feast day 11th June (c. 75)

Barnabas, a Jew of Cyprus, comes as close as anyone outside the Twelve to being a fully-fledged apostle. He was closely associated with Saint Paul, introduced Paul to Peter and the other apostles. and served as a mediator between the former persecutor and the still suspicious Jewish Christians. Barnabas is spoken of simply as one who dedicated his life to the Lord. He was a man "filled with the Holy Spirit and faith. Thereby, large numbers were added to the Lord." Even when he and Paul were expelled from Antioch in Pisidia—modern-day Turkey—they were "filled with joy and the Holy Spirit." (*Excerpt: Franciscan media*)

And so we have no eyes for things that are visible, but only for things that are invisible; for visible things last only for a time, and the invisible things are eternal.

For we know that when the tent that we live in on earth is folded up, there is a house built by God for us, an everlasting home not made by human hands, in the heavens.

Jn 12:31, 32

The prince of this world will now be cast out, and when I am lifted up from the earth I will draw all to myself, says the Lord.

GOSPEL

Mark 3:20-35

Jesus went home with his disciples, and such a crowd collected that they could not even have a meal. When his relatives heard of this, they set out to take charge of him, convinced he was out of his mind.

The scribes who had come down from Jerusalem were saying, 'Beelzebul is in him' and, 'It is through the prince of devils that he casts devils out.' So he called them to him and spoke to them in parables, 'How can Satan cast out Satan? If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot last. And if a household is divided against itself, that household can never stand. Now if Satan has rebelled against himself and is divided, he cannot stand either – it is the end of him. But no one can make his way into a strong man's house and burgle his property unless he has tied up the strong man first. Only then can he burgle his house.

'I tell you solemnly, all men's sins will be forgiven, and all their blasphemies; but let anyone blaspheme against the Holy Spirit and he will never have forgiveness: he is guilty of an eternal sin.' This was because they were saying, 'An unclean spirit is in him.'

His mother and brothers now arrived and, standing outside, sent in a

message asking for him. A crowd was sitting round him at the time the message was passed to him, 'Your mother and brothers and sisters are outside asking for you.' He replied, 'Who are my mother and my brothers?' And looking round at those sitting in a circle about him, he said, 'Here are my mother and my brothers. Anyone who does the will of God, that person is my brother and sister and mother.'

EXPLORING THE WORD

In Mark's Gospel today the scribes 'from Jerusalem' accuse Jesus of blasphemy and acting for Satan. They fail to see that in casting out demons Jesus is actually undermining the power of the evil one, dividing his 'house'. Instead, the scribes themselves are guilty of blasphemy. They attribute a power from God – the power to cast out demons – to Satan himself. God is willing to forgive all sins but the inability to distinguish good from evil makes one impervious to the presence of God and therefore beyond forgiveness. Those who recognise and do the will of God are the family members who stand united in faith.
