It is the Lord who gives sight to the blind, who raises up those who are bowed down, the Lord, who protects the stranger and upholds the widow and orphan.


It is the Lord who loves the just but thwarts the path of the wicked. The Lord will reign forever, Zion's God from age to age.

3RD SUNDAY OF ADVENT "GAUDETE SUNDAY"



One of the candles surrounding the Christ Candle in the Advent wreath is rose coloured, for Gaudete Sunday or Joy Sun-

day, the beginning of the third week in Advent.

Certain Sundays throughout the liturgical year have taken their names from the first word in Latin of the Introit, the entrance antiphon at Mass. Gaudete Sunday is one of these.

CATHEDRALS AND EARTHQUAKES

Christchurch N.Z. - "Quake City"

The September 2010 and February 2011 Earthquakes devastated Christchurch, with the ruined Anglican Christchurch Cathedral recognised world wide as the symbol of the city's fate. Lesser known is that the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament was also destroyed. It was built in 1905 in a renaissance style with twin bell towers and a prominent main dome. It is unlikely that either cathedral can be rebuilt from the highly unstable remains.

Our intention was to attend Mass in the cathedral, until we saw the photos of its ruins in the "Quake City Exhibition!"

However, the good news was that the co-cathedral was within walking distance of our motel.

A statue of Our Lady inside the cathedral survived, but rotated 180 degrees to finish up facing the City Centre.

Other churches were also destroyed. On the site of the demolished Presbyterian Church, now stands the "185 empty chairs" memorial for the lives lost in the 2011 quake. Each chair represents an individual, such as an office chair or a child's car capsule. Incidentally, a week after we left Christchurch, it experienced yet another strong earthquake.

palaces. Then what did you go out for? To see a prophet? Yes, I tell you, and much more than a prophet: he is the one of whom scripture says:

'Look, I am going to send my messenger before you; he will prepare your way before you.

'I tell you solemnly, of all the children born of women, a greater than John the Baptist has never been seen; yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he is.'

BACKGROUND ON THE GOSPEL READING

The third Sunday of Advent is traditionally called Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete is the Latin word meaning "rejoice." This Sunday is so named because "Rejoice" is the first word in the entrance antiphon for today's Mass taken from Philippians 4:4,5: "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice! The Lord is near." Some people mark this Sunday on their Advent wreath with a pink candle instead of a purple candle. This Sunday is a joyful reminder that our salvation is near.

This week's Gospel Reading continues our Advent reflection on the person and message of John the Baptist. Last week we heard John speak about his relationship to the coming Messiah, Jesus. This week, we hear Jesus' message to John the Baptist, now in prison, about the signs of the kingdom found in Jesus' ministry and Jesus' assessment of John's role in the Kingdom of God.

The Gospel of Matthew tells the story of John's arrest in chapter 14:3-12. In today's Gospel, John sends word to Jesus from prison, asking if Jesus is the Messiah for whom he has been waiting. Jesus responds by pointing to the miracles that he has worked and invites John and the other hearers to make their own determination. In his next breath, however, Jesus praises John for his role in preparing the way for Jesus. Then Jesus says that all of those who work for the Kingdom of God will be as great as John and even greater.

Jesus' message to John about the signs of the kingdom being performed recalls the salvation described by the prophet Isaiah. This passage is a reminder that the beginning of salvation is already mysteriously present to us, but also yet to be fulfilled. Salvation is already in our midst as manifest in the miraculous deeds of Jesus and in the Church. But

salvation is also to be fulfilled in the coming reign of God. Even as we observe our world today, we can find glimpses of God's work among us. Even more, we help to prepare the way for God's kingdom by our words and our deeds. This message is indeed a cause for rejoicing.

NET MINISTRIES AUSTRALIA SPONSORSHIP
