

#### ST. JOHN EUDES

Feast Day 19<sup>th</sup> August (1601 – 1680) John Eudes is probably best known for

the central theme of his writings: Jesus as the source of holiness; Mary as the model of the Christian life. His devotion to the Sacred Heart and to



Pope Pius XI to declare him the father of the liturgical cult of the Hearts of Jesus and Mary. (Excerpt: Franciscan media)

### ST. STEPHEN King OF HUNGARY Feast Day 16<sup>th</sup> August (970 – 1038)

St Stephen was born in Hungary. When he became a Christian at the age of ten,



he was given the name of Stephen. When Stephen became king, the country was still quite pagan. As some people were

violent and fierce, he decided to establish the Church solidly in Hungary. He placed the whole kingdom under the protection of Mary. Stephen was a strong, wise ruler. He enforced just laws, but he was also generous and kind to the poor. He loved to give gifts of money to beggars without letting them know who he was. Stephen was king of Hungary for forty-two years. He died on August 15, 1038. St. Stephen was proclaimed a saint by Pope St. Gregory VII in 1083.

### THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED **VIRGIN MARY**

### Feast Day 15th August

The Assumption signals the end of Mary's earthly life and marks her return to heaven to be reunited with Jesus.

While the bodies of both Jesus and Mary are now in heaven, there is a difference between the Assumption and the Ascension.



Where Jesus arose from the tomb and ascended into heaven by his own power, Mary's body was taken up to heaven by the power of her Son. For this reason we use different words to describe each event. One is the Ascension of Christ and the other, the Assumption of Mary.

#### ST. MAXIMILIAN MARY KOLBE Feast Day 14<sup>th</sup> August (1894 – 1941)

Maximillian Kolbe was born in Poland and became a Franciscan priest. He was arrested by the Na-

zis during World War 2 and sent to a camp in Auschwitz.

While imprisoned there ten men were chosen to die in reprisal for a prisoner escape. After offering himself in place of a young husband and father, he was accepted. He was the last of the ten to die after enduring two weeks of starvation, thirst and neglect.

#### IN HIS PRESENCE

Lord I place myself in Your presence. After the strain and turmoil of the day I rest quietly here, as a little boat, which has been tossed by the waves and buffeted by the wind,

rests secure in a sheltered harbour. Here my projects lose their power over me A healing process begins.

My fragmented self is reassembled and I am made whole again.

In Your presence, I experience my true worth, which consists not in doing but in being.

I surrender myself into Your hands. I am at peace. (Excerpt: Jesuit Newsletter)

'Lord,' he said 'if it is you, tell me to come to you across the water.'
'Come' said Jesus. Then Peter got out of the boat and started walking towards Jesus across the water, but as soon as he felt the force of the wind, he took fright and began to sink. 'Lord! Save me!' he cried. Jesus put out his hand at once and held him. 'Man of little faith,' he said 'why did you doubt?' And as they got into the boat the wind dropped. The men in the boat bowed down before him and said, 'Truly, you are the Son of God.'

#### **EXPLORING THE WORD**

A little noticed phrase in this text adds significantly to the way we understand this story. Jesus told the disciples to cross to the other side of the lake. In doing this they were heading away from the Jewish region and into gentile territory. The boat is a symbol of the Church and as such, we can detect in this text a reflection of the situation of Matthew's community who have been forced out of the synagogue and away from traditional Judaism. More and more, it is gentiles who are coming to belief in Jesus. This is causing fear and concern for some in the community.

Matthew gives a prominent place to Peter whose actions do not make sense except as a combination of impulsive love and faith weakened by doubt. While his full attention is on Jesus, Peter is fine, but as soon as he allows what is going on around him to distract him from Jesus, he begins to sink.


This text offers a parable of the Church besieged and being tossed about. Peter's response is to be bold and step out into the unknown, yet he is vulnerable. The great comfort is in the risen Lord stretching out his hand to restore morale. This manifestation of the power of Christ is greeted by that great acclamation of faith: Truly you are the Son of God.

#### SHARING THE TRADITION

The special role which Peter played in the core group of twelve disciples is well accepted. He is listed first among them, is often their spokesperson and he is clearly prominent in the original Jerusalem community. Tradition holds that Peter went to Rome and led the Christian community there. The Church accepts that the Bishop of Rome, the Pope, is the successor of Peter. What is important is the way Peter is portrayed: as a fisherman, fishing for souls (Lk 5:10); as the shepherd of the sheep of Christ (Jn 21:15-17); as an elder who addresses elders (1 Pt 5:1); as a receiver of special revelation (Acts 1:9-16); as one who can correct doctrinal misunderstanding (2 Pt 3:15-16); and as the rock on which the Church is built (Mt 16:18). Pope Francis is the 266th successor of Peter.

#### **DID YOU KNOW?**

- For the Hebrew people, the waters of the sea are a symbol of the chaos from which creation sprang. Never having been a seafaring people, they were fearful of the watery deep.
- Even today, storms can blow up on the Sea of Galilee very quickly and make it dangerous for boats out on the lake.
- In art, the Church is often represented as a boat. A boat carries its passengers through threatening waters but is not exempt from the turbulence of storms. The Church can bear us through the storms of life but it does not exempt us from the stresses and struggles.
