

THE PASSION OF ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST

Feast Day 29th August



The Church, having celebrated the earthly birthday of St. John the Baptist on June 24, today honours the anniversary of his martyrdom. Besides our Lord and our

Lady, St. John the Baptist is the only one whose birth and death are

thus celebrated. Today's Gospel relates the circumstances of his execution. He had the courage to blame Herod to his face for the scandal of his illegal union with his sister-in-law Herodias, whose husband was still alive. Herodias contrived to make Herod imprison him and took advantage of an unexpected opportunity to obtain through her daughter, Salome, the beheading of the saint. *(Catholic Culture.org)*

ST. GREGORY THE GREAT Feast Day 3rd September (540-604)

Gregory was a Pope and Doctor of the Church. He was the sixty-sixth Pope, and one of the greatest leaders the Catholic Faith has ever had. He reigned as

Roman Pontiff for fourteen years.

His mother, Sylva, was a saint, as were his aunts, Saint Aemiliana and Saint Tarsilla. Saint Gregory revived for the Catholic Church its great love for liturgical chant and music. Saint Gregory sent Saint Augustine of Canterbury to be the apostle of England, in 597. Below is an example of Gregorian Chant notation :

"My friend, move up higher." In that way, everyone with you at the table will see you honoured. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the man who humbles himself will be exalted."

Then he said to his host, 'When you give a lunch or a dinner, do not ask your friends, brothers, relations or rich neighbours, for fear they repay your courtesy by inviting you in return. No; when you have a party, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; that they cannot pay you back means that you are fortunate, because repayment will be made to you when the virtuous rise again.'

EXPLORING THE WORD

In Luke's Gospel, Jesus is often depicted as sharing meals with those people in the society of the time who were not considered to be appropriate table companions: publicans, tax collectors, sinners and women of dubious reputation. In this meal, Jesus reveals more of the radical reversal of God's way. He challenges the way the Pharisees see their own standing in society as people of status, urging them instead to take the more humble positions at table and allow the host, or God, to choose those who should be exalted. He also shatters the Pharisees' idea of table fellowship by urging them to share their festive table with those who are the least important or the outcasts of society. The way to God cannot be organised according to human priority! It was in the ultimate humiliation of crucifixion that Jesus is exalted in resurrection and ascension.

- What challenges does this text offer to society today or to the Church which sometimes excludes people of 'inappropriate status' from the Eucharistic table?
- Who are treated as the 'least important' in our modern world? Who are treated as the 'most important' in our modern world?

DID YOU KNOW?

- As we have noted before, in Scripture the wedding feast, a time of joyous celebration and abundance, is one of the traditional images of the kingdom of God.
- Society at the time of Jesus was organised along strictly hierarchical lines. People were very sensitive to their status in society and how they were treated.
- Pharisees are one among a number of groups within Jewish society. There were especially observant of the Law and were influential in society.

SYMBOLS AND IMAGES

Jesus is often portrayed in Luke's Gospel at table and sharing a meal. Meals are significant in human interaction and celebration. Jesus challenges both the conventions of his society and the understanding of who is 'important' and of highest place in this text. Instead, he invites the Pharisees, and we ourselves, to consider the poorest and most in need as our table companions, just as he did.
