SAINT FRANCIS OF ASSISI Feast Day 4th October



(b.1181 - d.1226)

Francis Bernardone was born in 1181 at Assisi, Umbria, Italy. Son of a wealthy cloth merchant, he lived a lavish and irresponsible life. At twenty he went to war against

Perugia, but was captured and imprisoned. During his imprisonment he experienced a vision from Christ, and embraced complete poverty, taking the Gospel as his rule of life. In 1209 he founded the Friars Minor (Franciscans). The first person (recorded) to receive the stigmata in 1224, Francis died on October 4, 1226 at Portiuncula, Italy. He was canonized by Gregory IX less than two years later. In 1979, he was named patron of ecology. *Catholic Culture; Franciscan Media*

OUR LADY OF THE ROSARY 7th October



The feast of Our Lady of the Rosary was instituted to honour Mary for the Christian victory over the Turks at Lepanto on October 7, 1571, commemorated by the invocation "Help of Christians." The Rosary, or the Psalter

of the Blessed Virgin Mary, is one of the best prayers to Mary. In modern times successive popes have urged the faithful to pray the Rosary. It is a form of contemplative, mental and vocal prayer, which brings down God's blessing on the Church. It is a biblically inspired prayer, centred on meditation on the mysteries of Christ in union with Mary, so closely associated with her Son in his redeeming activity. *Catholic Culture*



'Which of you, with a servant ploughing or minding sheep, would say to him when he returned from the fields, "Come and have your meal immediately"?

Would he not be more likely to say, "Get my supper laid; make yourself tidy and wait on me while I eat and drink. You can eat and drink yourself afterwards"? Must he be grateful to the servant for doing what he was told? So with you: when you have done all you have been told to do, say, "We are merely servants: we have done no more than our duty."



DOUBLE OR NOTHING

In recent years celebrity poker games from Las Vegas have become popular on TV. The famous and well-to-do gamble with somebody else's money. The winner has a big donation made in their name to a charity of their choosing. You be the judge of the morality of all this.

The drama occurs when a bet forces a player to bet all of his or her chips. That means they'll win a large hand or be out of the game completely. If you watch it long enough, you learn that it's easy to bet everything when you have a great hand, much harder if you are struggling. Or if you think your opponent is bluffing, you have a tough decision to make. But quite often, skill has nothing to do with the outcome. Everything depends on the draw of the cards.

We have done nothing in and of ourselves to deserve the faith that God has given us. It is a true gift and blessing from God. We are supposed

to play the hand that we are dealt. The prophet Habakkuk cries out for more faith even though he has enough. The apostles ask for an increase in faith, and Jesus tells them that they have more than enough.

When the chips are down (so to speak), do we believe our faith is strong enough to win or do we back off, asking for more? It is precisely when we are "all in" and place our trust in God that our faith makes us a winner, not matter the outcome.

The Commissioning: God goes with you as you leave this place, and God will go with you in the coming week. God's strength will get us through the rough places, God's grace will sustain us when the world lets us down, God's essential goodness will counter the corruption around us, God's acceptance will model our response to prejudice, God's love will embrace us and keep us eternally secure.
