

VISION AND MISSION STATEMENT


Our vision is to build a faith community, centred on the loving relationship of Father, Son and Holy Spirit, expressed in personal lives and in communal Parish activities.



SAINT MARIA GORETTI Feast Day 6th July

St. Maria Goretti was born near Ancona (Italy). The daughter of a poor peasant family, Maria was well known to her neighbours for her cheerfulness and piety. When she was twelve



she was a victim of assault. She preferred to die rather than to lose her virginity. She died in 1902, and her mother was present at her canonization in 1950, the first time a parent was present for a child's canonization. *Catholic Culture*

BLESSED PETER TO ROT Feast Day 7th July (b.1912 - d.1945)



Blessed Peter To Rot, a Catholic and catechist who stood firm in the faith during the Japanese occupation of his homeland New Guinea in World War II. He was arrested for his opposition to

Carry no purse, no haversack, no sandals. Salute no one on the road.

"Whatever house you go into, let your first words be, "Peace to this house!" And if a man of peace lives there, your peace will go and rest on him; if not, it will come back to you. Stay in the same house, taking what food and drink they have to offer, for the labourer deserves his wages; do not move from house to house.

"Whenever you go into a town where they make you welcome, eat what is set before you. Cure those in it who are sick, and say, "The kingdom of God is very near to you." But whenever you enter a town and they do not make you welcome, go out into its streets and say, "We wipe off the very dust of your town that clings to our feet, and leave it with you. Yet be sure of this: the kingdom of God is very near." I tell you, on that day it will not go as hard with Sodom as with that town."

The seventy-two came back rejoicing. 'Lord,' they said 'even the devils submit to us when we use your name.' He said to them, 'I watched Satan fall like lightning from heaven. Yes, I have given you power to tread underfoot serpents and scorpions and the whole strength of the enemy; nothing shall ever hurt you. Yet do not rejoice that the spirits submit to you; rejoice rather that your names are written in heaven.'



SLEEPING LIKE A BABY I love watching babies at church. I suppose I shouldn't admit that. It might sound as if I'm confessing to being distracted and not paying attention. But how can you not pay attention to a newborn - yawning, scrunching her little nose up, or trying to jam a fist into his mouth? And when they're a bit older it's fun to watch them look around from their perch in Mum or Dad's arms, taking in the lights and colours and strange people, their eyes wide with curiosity. My favourites are the ones who are totally collapsed into their parent's shoulder so we get to see their sweet sleeping face so full of contentment. As the parents move up to Communion or sway to the music (holding a baby gives you a license to

sway in church), the child's every need is met and the little one is content and satisfied and living in the now.

That's a state we can spend the rest of our lives trying to recapture. In fact the reading this week from Isaiah proclaims a promise from God that those who are faithful will be comforted, fed, carried in God's arms, and filled with joy so that we can collapse, like contented newborns, into God's care.

Yes, I love watching babies at church, and after hearing Isaiah describe God's promises, I know that this pastime isn't a distraction, it's a fleshand-blood meditation on God's total love for each and every person – even me.

The Commissioning: There is a harvest to be gathered for the Christian cause. You are challenged to be among those who gather the harvest. As harvesters, we will know when to speak and when to listen. We will know those to approach and those to avoid. We will know the times of opportunity and the inopportune times. We will know the scriptures that are appropriate and those that are not helpful. We will be ready to work practically and pray carefully. Remember the words of Jesus: "There is a large harvest but few workers to gather it in". GPBS eNews
