Far from relying on any power of my own, I came among you in great 'fear and trembling' and in my speeches and the sermons that I gave, there were none of the arguments that belong to philosophy; only a demonstration of the power of the Spirit. And I did this so that your faith should not depend on human philosophy but on the power of God.

19th January 2023 **Explorative Study: Youth and** Young Family Engagement Strategy

The engagement of youth and young families with the parish was an area raised by the survey of parishioners in 2022 and was also addressed by the Archbishop at the Annual General Assembly. The PPC agreed to form a Working Party to undertake an 'Explorative Study: Youth and Young Family Engagement Strategy'. The Working Party would investigate and present recommendations to the PPC.

# **Parish Vision and Mission Action Plan** 2023/2024.

PPC members were asked to nominate to lead the development of an area of the Action Plan. working with relevant groups in the Parish. The 5 areas are Celebrate the Eucharist, Grow a personal relationship with the Trinity. Care for Each Other, Care for our environment, and Reach Out.

# OUR LADY OF LOURDES Feast Day 11th February

Today marks the first apparition of the Blessed Virgin Mary in 1858 to fourteen-year-old Marie Bernade



(St. Bernadette) Soubirous. Between February 11 and July 16, 1858, the Blessed Virgin appeared eighteen times, and showed herself to St. Bernadette in the hollow of the rock at Lourdes. On the feast of the Annunciation, the beautiful Lady announced her name, "I am the Immaculate Conception." Since then the report spread quickly of cures occurring at the grotto and a great number of Christians visited the hallowed place. Publicity given to these miraculous events, and the seeming sincerity and innocence of the girl, made it necessary for the bishop of Tarbes to institute a judicial inquiry. Four years later he declared the apparitions supernatural and permitted public veneration of the Immaculate Conception in the grotto. A chapel was erected, Lourdes became a place of pilgrimage and many cures and conversions have taken place. Catholic Culture

# FOR THE SAKE OF OTHERS

(Matthew 5: 13 - 16)

The disciples are called "the salt of the earth" and "the light of the world". Consequently, their success will rest on not drawing attention to themselves. As salt is used for preservation and purification, the disciples are called to preserve what is good and purify what hinders God's reign. They cannot allow themselves to become "tasteless salt" that is diluted or dissolved by the cares and worries of the world. As light moves beyond itself and illumines objects in a room, the disciples are called to look beyond themselves by doing good works. This will lead others to glorify God, whom Matthew, for the first time, refers to as "your heavenly Father".

Ponder: How will I live out my vocation as salt and light?

# **SYMBOLS AND IMAGES**

The people of Israel often described the Law of God as 'salt' because it gave zest and flavour to life and it preserved them as the people of God. Similarly, the Law was often compared to a light that showed them the path to God: 'Your word is a light to my feet and a lamp to my path' (Psalm 119:105). Jerusalem, the city on the hill, was a focal point and reminder of God's presence. Jesus gives a new focus to all these images when he applies them to those who hear his word and put it into practice. All Christians are called to be 'salt' and 'light', a 'city on the hill' giving witness to God's presence.

### **GIVE FREELY AND OPENLY**

When Beth unexpectedly inherited a large amount of money, she was scared. She had never managed such a sum before, and she was intimidated by the prospect of handling this responsibility correctly. Her future would be secure as long as she didn't make any mistakes, so she set about learning how to invest wisely and working with trustworthy, expert professionals. And she resisted the

temptation to spend too much of it!

Through the process, she discovered confidence in herself. She could make smart financial decisions. That confidence led her to want to do more with the money - she wanted to help people with it and apply her newfound savvy. She became a philanthropist and she developed strategies to maximise the effectiveness of her gifts – one of which was widely telling others that she was giving to. She found her listeners then started donating to the same causes. She encouraged women in particular not to give anonymously, not to be too humble about their giving – in order to help other women realise they could do the same. It's not bragging if your intentions are charitable. Don't put your lamp under a basket indeed!

You can bring change by:

- Knowing the faithful way.
- Working quietly from the inside.
- Being ready to take the long-term approach.
- Listening to different points of view
- Being willing to find the facts.
- Taking the time that is needed.
- Refusing to give in or give up.
- Shining light on the darkest path.
