#### **OUR VISION:**


To build a faith community centred on the loving relationship of Father, Son and Holy Spirit, expressed in personal lives and communal parish activities.



# ANNUNCIATION OF THE LORD Feast Day 8th April

The feast of the Annunciation was first celebrated in the fourth or fifth century. Its central focus is the incarnation: God has become one of us. Mary has an important role in



God's plan. From all eternity, God destined her to be the mother of Jesus and closely related to him in the redemption of the world. It is a God-given role, God's grace from beginning to end. Mary became the eminent figure she is, only by God's grace: she is the empty space where God could act. Mary is the virgin-mother who fulfils Isaiah 7:14. She is united with her son in carrying out the will of God (Psalm 40:8-9; Hebrews 10:7-9;)) Franciscan Media Luke 1:38 "And Mary said: Behold the handmaid of the Lord: be it done to me according to Thy word. And the angel departed from her."(NRSV)

Towards the end of her life Jan was a volunteer at Open House for the Homeless, as well as helping out at the Messy Church services at our Goolwa church. She put her name down to serve on the PPC about 2 years ago but after just a couple of meetings her health problems led her to retire. On behalf of our parish we send our condolences to daughters Katie and Louise and their families.

Jan's funeral will be on Tuesday 16th April at 11.30 at Goolwa.

#### **HOUSE FULL AT ST JOHN'S**

After 100 people attended the Vigil Service at Goolwa on Saturday night a crowd of about 370 people attended the 9.00am morning Mass on Easter Sunday. A number were forced to stand outside at the back of the church or by the side doors. (Similar crowds were seen at St Joan's.) In typical Catholic style despite several calls that there were still 3 seats at the front of the church, nobody came forward! It reminded me of the eighties when then parish priest Mons. Horgan would not start Mass at Goolwa until more came forward and didn't cluster at the back of the church. Until they did he would not start Mass! It took a few tense minutes but the front pews soon got filled up and Mass began. Thanks to so many who worked leading up to the Easter and those who supported the services at this sacred time.

Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, 'Peace be with you', and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you.

'As the Father sent me, so am I sending you.'


After saying this he breathed on them and said:

'Receive the Holy Spirit. For those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven; for those whose sins you retain, they are retained.'

Thomas, called the Twin, who was one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. When the disciples said, 'We have seen the Lord', he answered, 'Unless I see the holes that the nails made in his hands and can put my finger into the holes they made, and unless I can put my hand into his side, I refuse to believe.' Eight days later the disciples were in the house again and Thomas was with them. The doors were closed, but Jesus came in and stood among them. 'Peace be with you' he said. Then he spoke to Thomas, 'Put your finger here; look, here are my hands. Give me your hand; put it into my side. Doubt no longer but believe.' Thomas replied, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him:

'You believe because you can see me. Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe.'

There were many other signs that Jesus worked and the disciples saw, but they are not recorded in this book. These are recorded so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing this you may have life through his name.



#### **BELIEVING IS SEEING**

Believing is seeing. We are taught it's the other way around: seeing is supposed to be believing. But we see a lot of things we don't believe. We see how old we are in the mirror and pretend the truth away with hair colour and makeup. We see injustices and rationalise them into sounding all right. We live as in George Orwell's

classic novel 1984, in which the news is rewritten daily to conform to the preferences of the powerful. "Facts" are more fluid than we care to admit. Many are convinced, not by what they see, but by what makes us all comfortable.

So it seems the reverse is true: believing is seeing. Our beliefs tell us how to see. They tell us what to look for. Faith gives us eyes to see what others may be blind to. The worldly view is cynical: things are bad and getting worse, and not much can be done. But through believing, we see the Kingdom coming, arriving as an invitation to grace in every hour. Believers have hope, which heals the past and invents the future. That's why, though we have not literally seen Jesus, we can believe in him, and in believing, we can truly see.

#### **KIDS' CORNER**

Have you ever done something you thought was so bad no one could forgive you? Almost everyone has. Peter was once so frightened that he pretended not to know Jesus. When he thought about what he'd done, he wept. And here Peter is again, speaking to the people who once cried out these words: "Crucify him!" Peter knows they can be forgiven just as he was, if only they will ask. Remember, God is merciful. GPBS eNews
