Amos 7:12-15

Amaziah, the priest of Bethel, said to Amos, 'Go away, seer, get back to the land of Judah; earn your bread there, do your prophesying there. We want no more prophesying in Bethel; this is the royal sanctuary, the national temple.' 'I was no prophet, neither did I belong to any of the brotherhoods of prophets,' Amos replied to Amaziah 'I was a shepherd and looked after sycamores; but it was the Lord who took me from herding the flock, and the Lord who said, "'Go, prophesy to my people Israel."'

SECOND READING

Ephesians 1:3-14

Blessed be God the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us with all the spiritual blessings of heaven in Christ.

Before the world was made, he chose us, chose us in Christ, to be holy and spotless, and to live through love in his presence, determining that we should become his adopted sons, through Jesus Christ, for his own kind purposes, to make us praise the glory of his

grace, his free gift to us in the Beloved, in whom, through his blood, we gain our freedom, the foregiveness of our sins. Such is the richness of the grace which he has showered on us in all wisdom and insight.

He has let us know the mystery of his purpose, the hidden plan he so kindly made in Christ from the beginning to act upon when the times had run their course to the end: that he would bring everything together under Christ, as head, everything in the heavens and everything on earth.

And it is in him that we were claimed as God's own, chosen from the beginning, under the predetermined plan of the one who guides all things as he decides by his own will; chosen to be, for his greater glory, the people who would put their hopes in Christ before he came.

Now you too, in him, have heard the message of the truth and the good news of your salvation, and have believed it: and you too have been stamped with the seal of the Holy Spirit of the Promise, the pledge of our inheritance which brings freedom for those whom God has taken for his own, to make his glory praised.



GOSPEL

Mark 6:7-13

Jesus summoned the Twelve and began to send them out in pairs giving them authority over the unclean spirits. And he instructed them to take nothing for the journey except a staff - no bread, no haversack, no coppers for their purses. They were to wear sandals but, he added, 'Do not take a spare tunic.' And he said to them, 'If you enter a house anywhere, stay there until you leave the district. And if any place does not welcome you and people refuse to listen to you, as you walk away shake off the dust from under your feet as a sign to them.' So they set off to preach repentance; and they cast out many devils, and anointed many sick people with oil and cured them.



THE FIRST TIME (Mark 6: 7 - 13)

We remember "firsts" in our lives because they are guideposts to where we've been and to where our lives are now pointed.

Remember that first kiss? Or that exciting first time driving the family car all alone? Remember receiving your very first pay-packet?

After a while, all those moments that made us so incredibly nervous the first time eventually become routine. They become second nature.

So imagine, if you can, the ragtag group of apostles, those 12 of Jesus' followers and disciples that he had set apart. Imagine – with all their faults and failings – how unsure they were in preaching repentance. Imagine their shock at their ability to drive out demons and cure the sick.

They were familiar with the scripture of God's chosen people. They knew that they had become like the prophets of old. And they would never be the same.

Dare we believe, even for a moment, that Jesus is calling us like the apostles, giving us authority over the unclean spirits in our world? He is indeed.

The apostles would have to experience the death and Resurrection of Jesus before they would go back to the tasks they performed this first time. We've already experienced the Easter mysteries, and now we, too, are called. The first time will not be the only or the last time for us either.

Go from here in the strength of God's love. When we stand for God's way, we stand our ground. We will speak out for justice. In the way of God's chosen one, we will confront the abuse of power. We will recognise the trap of the easy way out and will instead work for a fair and lasting resolution. When we feel most vulnerable, we will look to the example of Jesus.

You will go forward unafraid. We go in the strength of God's love.
