FIRST READING

Isaiah 66:18-21

The Lord says this: I am coming to gather the nations of every language. They shall come to witness my glory. I will give them a sign and send some of their survivors to the nations: to Tarshish, Put, Lud, Moshech, Rosh, Tubal, and Javan, to the distant islands that have never heard of me or seen my glory. They will proclaim my glory to the nations. As an offering to the Lord they will bring all your brothers, on horses, in chariots, in litters, on mules, on dromedaries, from all the nations to my holy mountain in Jerusalem, says the Lord, like Israelites bringing oblations in clean vessels to the Temple of the Lord. And of some of them I will make priests and Levites, says the Lord.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM

Psalm 116:1-2

Go out to all the world; and tell the Good News.

SECOND READING

Hebrews 12:5-7, 11-13

Have you forgotten that encouraging text in which you are addressed as sons? My son, when the Lord corrects you, do not treat it lightly; but do not get discouraged when he reprimands you. For the Lord trains the ones that he loves and he punishes all those that he acknowledges as his sons.

Suffering is part of your training; God is treating you as his sons. Has there ever been any son whose father did not train him? Of course, any punishment is most painful at the time, and far from pleasant; but later, in those on whom it has been used, it bears fruit in peace and goodness. So hold up your limp arms and steady your trembling knees and smooth out the path you tread; then the injured limb will not be wrenched, it will grow strong again.

FEEDBACK TO THE DIOCESAN ASSEMBLY

Recently as a follow up to the Diocesan Assembly held at the end of last year parishes were asked to examine the suggestions that came from the Assembly and choose three for the Archdiocese to implement and three for our parish to implement.

The PPC has chosen the following:

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR THE ARCHDIOCESE:

Cry of the Earth, Cry of the Poor

Greater collaboration and partnerships are developed between the archdiocese, parishes, schools, communities, agencies, families, other churches and religious groups, non-church organisations, etc. to work for justice, peace and an integral ecology.

Inclusion and Healing

Develop inclusive reconciliation processes that begin with acknowledgement/apology of the harm, pain and lack of inclusion on behalf of the church and work toward healing and becoming a more open and inclusive community. Conduct a Rite of Healing and lamentation.

(Comment: There are many groups who have felt this lack of inclusion - First Nations people, divorced and remarried couples, sexually abused persons and their families etc.)

• Leadership and Leadership Formation Enable opportunities for all the laity, but especially women, to undertake roles of leader ship in all areas of Archdiocesan life including parishes and communities.

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR OUR PARISH

We are submitting our Vision and Mission Statement which reflects many of the themes of



the Diocesan Assembly and contains sections for action in the following areas:

- 1. Celebrate the Eucharist
- 2. Grow a personal relationship with the Trinity

The Diocesan Assembly will reconvene on 22nd & 23rd October 2022 followed by our own Parish Annual General Assembly on 30th October

QUEENSHIP OF MARY Feast Day 22nd August



With the certainty of faith we know that Jesus Christ is king in the full, literal, and absolute sense of the word; for He is true God and man. This does not, however, prevent Mary from sharing His royal prerogatives,

though in a limited and analogous manner; for she was the Mother of Christ, and Christ is God; and she shared in the work of the divine Redeemer, in His struggles against enemies and in the triumph He won over them all. From this union with Christ the King she assuredly obtains so eminent a status that she stands high above all created things; and upon this same union with Christ is based that royal privilege enabling her to distribute the treasures of the kingdom of the divine Redeemer. And lastly, this same union with Christ is the fountain of the inexhaustible efficacy of her motherly intercession in the presence of the Son and of the Father.

DECLINE IN VOLUNTEERS & COMMUNITY LIFE

Reports compiled by the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission (ACNC) show the number of volunteers has been steadily falling each year. But Mr Leigh, the Charities Minister, says the problem is broader than volunteerism. Australians are now less likely to be a member of a community organisation, go to religious services, be a union member, play a team sport, give blood, and don't have as many friends or know as many neighbours as they used to.

"I'm trying to use the charities portfolio as a community-building portfolio to deal with what I think is one of the biggest challenges that Australia faces, which is the collapse of community life," he said. We give thanks for our parish community and the many volunteers who serve us.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

Jn14:6

Alleluia, alleluia! I am the way, the truth, and the life, says the Lord; no one comes to the Father, except through me. Alleluia!

GOSPEL

Luke 13:22-30

Through towns and villages Jesus went teaching, making his way to Jerusalem. Someone said to him, 'Sir, will there be only a few saved?' He said to them, 'Try your best to enter by the narrow door, because, I tell you, many will try to enter and will not succeed.

'Once the master of the house has got up and locked the door, you may find yourself knocking on the door, saying, "Lord, open to us" but he will answer, "I do not know where you come from." Then you will find yourself saying, "We once ate and drank in your company; you taught in our streets" but he will reply, "I do not know where you come from. Away from me, all you wicked men!"

'Then there will be weeping and grinding of teeth, when you see Abraham and Isaac and Jacob and all the prophets in the kingdom of God, and yourselves turned outside. And men from east and west, from north and south, will come to take their places at the feast in the kingdom of God.

'Yes, there are those now last who will be first, and those now first who will be last.'

EXPLORING THE WORD

As the chosen people, the Jews believed they were in a privileged relationship with God. In this text, Jesus shatters some illusions. There is no privileged or exclusive entry to the kingdom of God by those who see themselves as 'religious insiders'. This is equally directed to the disciples. It is not enough that they have shared a meal with Jesus or have heard his word. They must

respond to that word and act on it. They must enter by the narrow door, and this requires great effort, or else those who thought themselves 'inside' could find themselves 'outside', while others, 'the outsiders', will find their way ahead of them. This radical reversal of values and expectations would have shocked those who thought they were on the 'inside'.

SYMBOLS AND IMAGES

One of the most common images of the kingdom of God is that of the feast or the banquet. A feast is not simply a meal; it is an abundant celebration of something wonderful, from which people draw nourishment, life and vitality. Such is the kingdom of God.

SHARING THE TRADITION

Who will be saved? This is a difficult question. There is no doubt that God wants all people to be saved and that Jesus died to save all people.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church states, 'Believing in Jesus Christ and in the One who sent him for our salvation is necessary for that salvation'
