put all things under his feet.



FEAST OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

In the icon that forms part of our Vision and Mission Statement we see the Three Persons seated at a table.

Contained in the centre of the circle is the lamb, slain, the holy meal brought to the table. The space at this table is on our side. We are invited to join the group at the table and receive

the heart of their being for ourselves. We are invited to complete the circle in the world by our own response.

Father, you sent your Son to bring us truth and your Spirit to make us holy. Take us into the heart of your love. Help us to show that love to all we meet.

ST THOMAS MORE Feast Day June 22nd 1478 - 1535

Described as "a man for all seasons," More was a literary scholar, eminent lawyer, gentleman, father of four children, and chancellor of England. An intensely spiritual man, he would not support the king's divorce from Catherine of Aragon in order to marry Anne Boleyn. Nor would he acknowledge Henry as supreme head of the Church in England, breaking with Rome, and denying the pope as head. Few saints are more relevant to our time. In the year 2000, in fact, Pope John Paul II named him

patron of political leaders. He did not compromise his own moral values in order to please the king, knowing that true allegiance to authority is not blind acceptance of everything that authority wants.

VENERABLE MATT TALBOT Feast Day 19th June 1856-1925

Matt can be considered the patron of men and women struggling with alcoholism. After a few

years of schooling, Matt obtained work as a messenger for some liquor merchants; there he began to drink excessively. For 15 years -until he was almost 30 - Matt was an

active alcoholic. One day he decided to take "the pledge" for three months, make a general confession and begin to attend daily Mass. He began to pray as intensely as he used to drink. Only alcoholic men and women who have stopped drinking can fully appreciate how difficult the earliest years of sobriety were for Matt He had to take one day at a time. A good model for any life. *Franciscan Media*

GOSPEL

John 16:12-15

Jesus said to his disciples:


'I still have many things to say to you but they would be too much for you now.

But when the Spirit of truth comes he will lead you to the complete truth, since he will not be speaking as from himself but will say only what he has learnt; and he will tell you of the things to come. He will glorify me, since all he

He will glorify me, since all he tells you will be taken from what is mine.

Everything the Father has is mine; that is why I said:

All he tells you will be taken from what is mine.'



DID YOU KNOW?

- The early Christians struggled to understand the belief that God is both one and three. Many great councils of the church were held to clarify what this meant and to find the language with which to describe the trinitarian relationship between Father, Son and Spirit. It was not until the Council of Constantinople in ad 381 that the doctrine of the Trinity was defined.
- Many of the prayers of the church express our belief in a triune God (three persons in one). One of the greatest and most simple of these prayers is the sign of the cross, in which we dedicate ourselves 'in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit'.
- St Augustine described the Trinity in terms of the Lover, the Beloved and the Love that exists between them.
- St Patrick reportedly used the shamrock to explain the three persons in one God to the pagans of Ireland.


SYMBOLS AND IMAGES

Human beings will always struggle before the mystery of God, who is one but also three. Augustine's idea of the Trinity as a communion of love is a very rich and powerful image. Can our own communion of love with others teach us something of the life and love of the Trinity?

EXPLORING THE WORD

The people of Israel were unique among the nations of the ancient world in that they held to a belief in one God. But Jesus speaks of this God as 'Abba', Father. There is an implied relationship with this God. Jesus also speaks of the Spirit, and again, there is a relationship implied between Jesus and the Spirit, for this Spirit will continue to speak the words of God and of Jesus and will glorify them. Thus begins the early church's deep reflection on the mystery of Jesus and the relationship between Father, Son and Spirit. This relationship was ultimately formulated in what we now call the Trinity.

In this text, Jesus is addressing all those who will search for the truth down the centuries to come. All of us are led to complete truth and understanding through the actions of the Spirit, who directs us to the Father and the Son: 'At the heart of the mystery of the Trinity is a Father whose love is incarnated in the Son who gives life to the world, and in the mutual love which exists between the Father and the Son and touches our lives as the Holy Spirit' F. Maloney
