### ST BERNARD Feast Day 20<sup>th</sup> August (1090 –1153)



Western Europe's "man of the twelfth century," without doubt or controversy, had to be Bernard of Clairvaux. Bernard's life in the Church was more active than we can

imagine possible today. His efforts produced far-reaching results. But he knew that they would have availed little without the many hours of prayer and contemplation that brought him strength and heavenly direction. His life was characterised by a deep devotion to the Blessed Mother. His sermons and books about Mary are still the standard of Marian theology. *(Excerpt: Franciscan media)* 

### STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

A wise person recognises that all we have and all we are comes from God. A wise person thanks God continually throughout the day for all His many blessings. A wise person realises that God has blessed us for a reason and that He wants us to help Him build His Kingdom on earth.

## THE QUEENSHIP OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY Feast Day 22<sup>nd</sup> August

As Jesus was to be king of all creation, Mary, in dependence on Jesus, was to be queen.

All other titles to queenship derive from this eternal intention of God. As Jesus exercised His kingship on earth by serving His Father and His fellow human beings, so did Mary exercise her

queenship. As the glorified Jesus remains with us as our king till the end of time (Matthew 28:20), so does Mary, who was assumed into heaven and crowned queen of heaven and earth.

### ST PIUS X Feast Day 21<sup>st</sup> August (1835-1914)

St Pius X, formerly the parish priest of Tombolo, remained a country priest at heart. Throughout his life, he faced the problems and evils of a strife-torn world with spiritual fervour.

The inscription on his tomb in the crypt of the Basilica of St Peter's gives an eloquent testimony to a life spent in the service of God:

### ST BARTHOLOMEW, APOSTLE

**Feast Day 24<sup>th</sup> August (1<sup>st</sup> Century)** Saint Bartholomew is one of the twelve Apostles and was introduced to Jesus through St Philip. Unfortunately, not very much is known about St Bartholomew compared with some of the others Apostles. We do know that he was martyred by being flayed alive in Armenia, which means that we can assume he preached and evangelized. *(Excerpt: the catholic company)*

shall raise him up on the last day. For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink. He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood lives in me and I live in him. As I, who am sent by the living Father, myself draw life from the Father, so whoever eats me will draw life from me. This is the bread come down from

heaven; not like the bread our ancestors ate: they are dead, but anyone who eats this bread will live for ever.'



### **DID YOU KNOW?**

- After the flood (Gen. 6-8) God established a covenant with Noah. He promised never again to send a deluge on the Earth and said to Noah, 'every living and crawling thing shall provide food for you, no less than the foliage of plants. I give you everything, with this exception: you must not eat flesh with life, that is to say blood, in it' (Gen 9:3).
- Based on Scripture, Jewish people have various laws governing what may or may not be eaten. These rigorous dietary laws are adhered to even today.

### **EXPLORING THE WORD**

In the continuation of the discourse, Jesus' claim that he is the living bread come from heaven is brought to a new height. Not only has he surpassed the manna given by God in the desert, he now claims that it is his flesh and blood which gives life. For the Jews this is an abomination. The very strict dietary laws of Judaism precluded the eating of flesh with blood in it. Jesus' hearers again remain at the physical understanding of his words. They imagine some form of cannibalism and are outraged. 'How can this man give us his flesh to eat?' But Jesus is not deterred. He insists that he makes God known because he comes from God. Eating the flesh and drinking the blood of the Son of Man will bring those who believe to


eternal life – not the physical life of this world but to life with the Father forever.

### SHARING THE TRADITION

The Church has always insisted that the bread and wine of the Eucharist are the true flesh and blood of Christ. While the appearance of bread and wine remain, in reality they become the body and blood of the Lord. Catholics differ in this from some other Christian traditions. This basic doctrine is the reason why other Christians may not receive communion in Catholic churches nor Catholics partake of the bread and wine in other Christian churches.

### LIVING THE WORD

Bread is the food of life. Food is essential for our bodies to function. But food and drink also give pleasure and satisfaction. When people come together to celebrate, food and drink are part of the celebration. As food and drink are to the human person so Jesus is to those who believe in him.
