

ST JOHN PAUL II, Feast Day 22nd October (1920 – 2005) Charles Joseph Wotjtyła was born in 1920 in Wadowice, Poland.



After his ordination to the priesthood and theological studies in Rome, he returned to his homeland and resumed various pastoral and academic tasks.

He became first auxiliary bishop and, in 1964, Archbishop of Krakow and took part in the Second Vatican Council. On October 16, 1978 he was elected pope and took the name John Paul II.

His exceptional apostolic zeal, particularly for families, young people and the sick, led him to numerous pastoral visits throughout the world. Among the many fruits which he has left as a heritage to the Church are above all his rich Magisterium and the promulgation of the Catechism of the Catholic Church as well as the Code of Canon Law for the Latin Church and for the Eastern Churches.

In Rome on April 2, 2005 he departed peacefully in the Lord. (Excerpt: Roman Missal)

ST ANTHONY MARY CLARET Feast Day 24th October

St Anthony Mary Claret of Spain founded the Claretians.

He was a missionary to the Canary Islands and became the Archbishop of Cuba where he erected a hospital and built numerous schools and founded a religious library. A strong believer in education, he distributed books wherever he preached.

Anthony Mary Claret had the gift of prophecy and

performed many miracles. He returned to the court of Queen Isabella II as confessor and went into exile with her in 1868. In 1869 and 1870, Anthony participated in the First Vatican Council. He died in the Cistercian monastery of Fontfroide in southern France on October 24, 1870. (Excerpt: Catholic online)

be baptised, but as for seats at my right hand or my left, these are not mine to grant; they belong to those to whom they have been allotted.'

When the other ten heard this they began to feel indignant with James and John, so Jesus called them to him and said to them, 'You know that among the pagans their so-called rulers lord it over them, and their great men make their authority felt.

This is not to happen among you. No; anyone who wants to become great among you must be your servant, and anyone who wants to be first among you must be slave to all. For the Son of Man himself did not come to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.'

DID YOU KNOW?

- The brothers, James and John, sons of Zebedee, were nicknamed by Jesus 'sons of thunder'.
- Acts 12:2 reports the martyrdom of James. He was killed, probably by decapitation, by Herod Agrippa, grandson of Herod the Great, during a persecution of the early Church.
- According to some traditions John survived until the end of the first century and lived in Ephesus.


EXPLORING THE WORD

On three occasions Jesus has told his disciples of his approaching passion and death (Mk 8:31; 9:31; 10:32–34). Here James and John enthusiastically, if somewhat naively, commit themselves to following him in drinking the cup and undergoing the baptism which Jesus faces. Do they really understand the cost of discipleship? Their question to Jesus would indicate that they have still not fully grasped what it means to follow Jesus. They want him to do their will

rather than them doing the will of the Father. They still seem to be thinking in terms of a political and earthly kingdom where power and riches will come to those who are in special places of favour at the right and left hand of the ruler. Instead, Jesus offers them a share in his suffering and death. The other disciples too display their human weakness in their indignation that they may be left out. Jesus tries again to make it clear to his foolish disciples that their view of the world, locked as it is in their earthly experience, is not how God plans things to be. Christianity is not a state where power and authority is lorded over others. Instead it is a call to service and humility and may come at great cost.

THE PRAYER OF ST IGNATIUS LOYOLA

Lord Jesus teach me to be generous, to serve you as you deserve to be served, to give without counting the cost, to fight without heeding the wounds, to work without seeking rest, to spend my life without expecting any other return than the knowledge that I do your will.
